

University was held. The tentative schedule is as follows:



Have you had a chance to see the new **District Governor's Contest?** It is quite different from what we've become accustomed to in the last few





MESSAGE FROM OUR DISTRICT GOVERNOR

Dear Lions of 18A:

First let me say thank you again for the opportunity to serve as your District Governor for Lions year 2010-2011. Looking at the list of Past District Governors of this great district, it is an honor in itself just to be associated with those Lions. I can only offer my 100% best to live up to the standard set by them and the expectations you have.

This promises to be another challenging year and I know this district will be up to the task once again. We chartered two new Lions Clubs last year in Douglas County and Ringgold and another was formed and will likely charter in July or August this year. Yet, membership still remains a problem. The main emphasis this year will be on retention, followed closely by adding new clubs. Our goal is to add one new club in each region.

From July 2009 through May this year, District 18A has added 171 new members. In the same period it lost 210. Some of the losses were, unfortunately, due to death and transfers out of our district and there's little we can do about that. The vast majority of losses, however, may have been prevented. Our district cannot survive losing more members than it gains. There are many reasons why individuals drop their membership, but I believe the majority of those reasons are preventable.

We have an excellent MERL team in this district which is ready and willing to do whatever it takes to help our clubs with issues of membership, extension, retention & leadership. All it takes is a phone call or email.

Some of the other goals this year are:

Lower the average age of our membership by recruiting some younger members; Improve attendance at ALL Lions meetings, especially first timers; Have 2 from each club attend the USA/Canada Forum; More inter-club, inter-zone, and inter-region visitations; Add new community service projects. Remember our motto is "We Serve", not "We Sell". Let's make ourselves known in our communities. 100% club participation in White Cane

If any district can accomplish all those goals, it is District 18A: the "PRIDE" of Georgia Lionism.

I look forward to working with all of you this year.



Update from Recording for the Blind and Dyslexic

magine if every time you looked at a book....Every time you tried to read a newspaper....Every time you tried to read a billboard or STOP sign....The content sometimes seems incomprehensible. Jumbled. Insideout. Or something that just didn't make sense. That's what it's like for a person struggling with dyslexia. The frustration, the pain, and the trauma can last a lifetime.

That's what it was like for Skye, one of those kids who knows exactly what it's like to grow up with a print disability. Even though she is incredibly bright and capable, Skye was born with dyslexia, which made reading an ordeal for her. While her friends in school were enjoying the Harry Potter books, Skye struggled to read even the simplest textbooks.

Then one day two wonderful things happened which changed Skye's life forever. First, her mom took her to a neuropsychologist, who diagnosed Skye with dyslexia. The other thing was RDB&D!! Thanks to Lions like you and me, RFB&D was able to reach out to Skye, becoming her extra set of

eyes and ears in the classroom. By using her specialized CD player, and RFB&D CDs for her homework, Skye was able to keep up with her class, and learn from the very same books her classmates were using.

Thanks to the efforts of the Lions through RFB&D, barriers were

removed for Skye and thousands of young people just like her throughout Georgia and the US. Thanks for providing the tools they needed to help them reach their potential!
